### Fall, Spring, Summer 2018

Through the Center's Artists in Schools and Communities program, supported by the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, I taught illustration to young men convicted as adults at the Allegheny County Jail. I then taught puppetry and sculpture at a summer program with Pittsburgh Public Schools for students new to the country.

# PearlArts Studio, Pittsburgh, PA — Artist in Residence

### Summer, 2017

This was a six-week movement residency where I studied the expression of gesture and verbiage in Greek mythology, resulting in a three-person marionette show called *Hope Rises*.

#### **Artist Statement**

Deeply rooted in community, my work seeks to honor our shared imagination and curiosity through accessible object performance, movement, and puppetry. This art form invites us to come together to create the worlds we hope to inhabit. I am inspired by our collective need for understanding and joy. My work often uses found objects, cardboard, and fiddly technical assemblages to illustrate complex subjects and honor the inanimate.

Independent tour of a solo children's puppet show made entirely of repurposed materials to libraries, children's museums, independent bookstores, shelters, and art galleries in several east coast cities.

In my time at UConn, I worked as a Learning Community Innovation Zone Maker Fellow as well as a Graduate Assistant at the Ballard Institute and Museum of Puppetry. I organized the first-ever Women in Making Forum, and helped facilitate a forum on Women in Puppetry. I also applied for and received emergency grant funding from the Connecticut Arts Council to continue online, accessible puppet-making workshops through the COVID-19 Pandemic, increasing our community engagement by 35% in the year 2020. Additionally, my work led to a multi-year partnership with the Collaboratorium on Student Health and Wellness, resulting in bilingual puppetry workshops on mental health strategies for young children.

### Acheson Walsh Studios, New York City — apprenticeship

### June 2019 - August 2019

As a fabricator, I worked extensively with various types of foam to pattern, cut, and glue large-scale puppets for the touring versions of several Eric Carle plays. I also created Baubles for the Lincoln Center Christmas show, and was privy to planning and prototype phases for other projects.
